

HIV TELEECHO CLINIC

There is overwhelming research evidence showing that people living with HIV achieve better healthcare outcomes when they are treated by providers that are knowledgeable in HIV, as well as when they are treated in their own communities. The HIV TeleECHO Clinic unites a multidisciplinary team of experts in HIV care at a central conferencing site with healthcare providers treating HIV patients in rural, underserved, and key population areas. Individual cases are presented by the treating provider and discussed by the group in order to provide consultative advice on the clinical management of HIV patients. Relevant peer-reviewed articles, literature, and resources are circulated to participants to enhance their knowledge base and continuing medical education credits are provided.

How to Participate in our HIV TeleECHO Clinic

- Participants complete periodic surveys evaluating practice-style, knowledge, and self-efficacy related to the treatment of HIV.
- Present patient/client cases via telephone or webcam
- Participate in didactic presentations

Project ECHO™ & New Mexico AIDS Education and Training Center welcome you to participate in our weekly HIV telehealth sessions. A certificate of completion will be provided to those who participate in 75% (27 total) of ECHO HIV sessions and present at least five cases for discussion.
